

# Token Curated List Policies

➤ The token symbol should be a transparent PNG of at least 200x200 px. It should not weight more than 1MB. It should be centered and take most of the space available in the image. It should not include the project or token name unless the symbol always includes it. It should be of a definition high enough such that it should not appear pixelated or blurry unless those are on-purpose features of the symbol. The logo should be fully included.

Whether a submission should be accepted or denied depends on whether it is compliant or violates the policy. Let's check if the uploaded logo of Morpheus.Network complies to all the rules in the policy regarding logos.

## 1. "The token symbol should be a transparent PNG of at least 200x200 px."

It's straightforward that the uploaded logo is transparent and at least 200x200 px. If the logo wouldn't be transparent, then we would have seen a fully white background (as is the case with for instance the latest ICON submission). According to my computer the image's dimensions are 342x243 px.

## 2. "It should not weight more than 1MB."

According to my computer the image size is 39.7 KB, which is obviously less than 1 MB.

## 3. "It should be centered and take most of the space available in the image."

Looks good as well. Definitely compliant with this rule.

## 4. "It should not include the project or token name unless the symbol always includes it."

The submitter correctly uploaded a Morpheus.Network logo without the project name included, as the logo doesn't always include it.

## 5. "It should be of a definition high enough such that it should not appear pixelated or blurry unless those are on-purpose features of the symbol."

The logo does not look pixelated and it is undoubtedly of a high enough definition.

## 6. "The logo should be fully included."

The logo is without a doubt fully included.

After checking each single policy rule against the submitted Morpheus.Network logo, I can safely conclude that the submitted logo **does not** violate any policy rule. On top of that, the submission does not violate any precedence. The uploaded logo is the logo used on the official website, thus it's from an official source. Because a logo has shadows does not mean it should be denied from the TCR. We are not here to invent random rules, instead jurors should follow the applicable policy. Because of all the above, I deem the submission compliant and urge the jurors to vote **"Yes, Add It"**.
