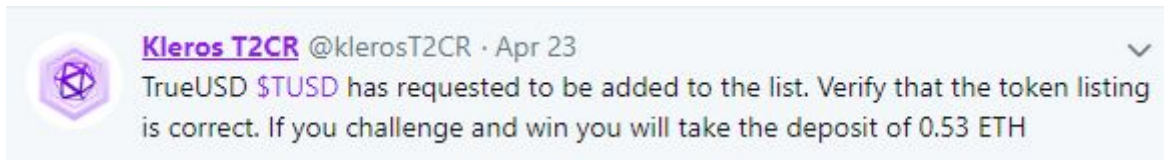


I decided to help the requester in this case by funding his side for the appeal. The challenger's (loser) side has already been fully funded, but the requester's (winner) side still had 0% appeal funding. I did this because the requester acted correctly to the information he had at the time of the submission.



When TrueUSD (TUSD) was submitted on April 23, the only available TUSD logo was as can be seen in the evidence of the requester:

You can clearly see that the logos displayed on the official webpage of TrueUSD matches the submitted logo. Furthermore, other sources like CoinMarketCap use the same logo as submitted by the requester.

Then, one day after the submission of TUSD to Kleros, TrustToken company announced their updated logo designs. This was outside requester's control, as the logo that he submitted was correct at the moment when the submission was made. Proof of this can be found in the evidence file linked above.

Looking at the details of the TUSD logo from the official media kit drive further proves that the logo change was enacted after the submission had already been done. The submission to the TCR was done on April 23, while the new TUSD logo was created on April 24.
